MINISTER'S MUSINGS

We are Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!" These are words that come to us from St. Augustine, who uttered them over 1500 years ago. He was expressing the joy that's unleashed with the resurrection of Christ, the joy that comes from knowing that the stone has been rolled away and the tomb is now empty. Because of Easter, death's dominion has been broken, and the door to eternal life has been thrown open. At Easter, Alleluias tumble from our lips as we give praise to God and raise our Easter song. Easter not only brings us joy, it changes us. As we celebrate Christ's victory over death, we discover the possibility of sharing in that victory ourselves. We ourselves can participate in the new reality that bursts into our world like a violent earthquake. We ourselves can take part in the Easter that God has inaugurated. Easter now defines who we are. Easter should infuse every corner of our being. Then, instead of just telling the Easter story, we can live

of our being. Then, instead of just telling the Easter story, we can live with that story imprinted on our hearts. Then, instead of just

celebrating Easter Sunday, we can live as Easter people. When dawn breaks on Easter morning, and the sun seems to shine directly into our souls, living as an Easter people feels like the easiest thing in the world to do.

We all, I'm sure, want to be Easter people. We all want Easter to be an ongoing, present reality in our lives. But even as we bask in the glories of Easter Sunday, complications can arise. The difficulty, as someone has pointed out, is that we are Easter people living in a Good Friday world. Easter has come, but Good Friday hasn't yet passed away. The world of Good Friday still stares us in the face. Jesus is raised, but the Romans are still in charge. Human suffering still prevails. Poverty and hunger still claw at human souls. Injustice and violence still practise their indignities. Disease and pain still imprison many lives. Loneliness and grief still bruise many hearts. For all of our talk of Easter, the calendar seems perpetually stuck on Good Friday. Being Easter people does not mean an escape from the Good Friday realities of the world in which we live. Christ is risen, but the wider world remains the same. The world around us looks as broken as ever. Struggles and disappointments still clutter our days. We may be Easter people, but that doesn't mean our lives are free of tears.

But as we live in this Good Friday world, with all of its troubles and trials, we do so as Easter people. We do so as people for whom the story of Christ's resurrection is not just a tale from the ancient past, but

a present reality, blessing us in the present moment, and affecting our lives in the here and now. Being Easter people means Christ's resurrection has touched us too. It means that the new life – the abundant life – that God has raised up with Christ is now available to us. And we can experience in our own hearts the joy that's unleashed when Easter becomes not just a day on the calendar, but a way of life. We can find ourselves singing unceasing praise to God for the new life he's given us – a new life that fills us with numberless blessings - a new life that's strong enough to withstand even the worst troubles and trials. With Christ living in us, infusing us with resurrection life, we truly can say, "We are Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!"

Rev. Kim has been cleared to return to his full duties as our Minister by his doctors and Presbytery has approved his returning to full time ministry. He will be leading the service on March 31st and is officially assuming his duties as of April 1, 2024.

A Congregational meeting has been called for April 14, 2024 following the service. The purpose of the meeting is to approve the financial statements for 2023.
