Minister's Musings

Grace-filled Church

Philip Yancey relates a question posed by Gordon McDonald during a conversation with him: What is the one thing the church has to offer that the world cannot get anywhere else? After all, MacDonald notes, you don't have to be a Christian to build home for the homeless, feed the poor, or donate to charity. You don't have to be a Christian to try to effect political change or pass social legislation. There are other traditions and teachers that offer wise moral instruction. What's the one thing that the church has to offer that the world cannot get anywhere else? Grace! Where else can the world go to find grace? Living in grace, remembering grace, keeps love alive.

Let's live in grace. Let's remember grace. We need to stand close to the cross. We need to regularly and honestly examine ourselves, confess our sins and shortcomings, and accept God's word of forgiveness. It is much harder to be ungracious to people, to refuse to forgive others, when we're standing in the shadow of Christ.

We also need to stay close to those who might be called "gracious-providing" people. We need to some people who accept us, welcome us, and love us, no matter what. I need some grace-providers. You do too. You need them because you have other kinds of people in your life, who will judge you and critique you and remind you of your raggedness in ways that will tear you down.

May we be a grace-filled, grace-dispensing church. May we be grace-filled, grace-providing Christians. When we are together, let's nourish culture of grace.

We would like to introduce you to our awesome team. Okelo Aballa, Kwo Ojulo, Doug Bonar, Colleen Doyle, Colleen Broadwell, Evelyn Good, Omot Ochudho, Joseph Omot, Daniel Aballa and Pat McKinnon.

We have had a super busy year with several local initiatives that are ongoing throughout the year. In the summer we have a community garden which is planted and tended by members of the congregation. When harvested, the vegetables are given to Robert McClure church's community food bank.

Our team also headed the food bank contributions that are given by the congregation. Our thanks to Joe Peter who made the deliveries to the Calgary Food Bank, this past year.

In the past year we have spent many long hours on our international initiative. We applied for and received approval to sponsor a family of seven. They currently live in a resettlement camp in Kenya and wish to settle in Canada. This past year our team worked on the necessary paperwork and did several fundraisers to raise the needed funds we would need to support this family for the first year that they are in Canada. We received a \$5000. donation from Pilipino seniors. We are very grateful. We also were given a \$1000. donation from CCWF. Thank you very much ladies. We also, found, stored and searched for "in kind" furniture, kitchen items, bedding, clothing.

With a go ahead from Kenya in the summer, we got word that the family would be arriving in Calgary on November 06. What a surprise that was for the whole team, as we were thinking in terms of years, not months, when they would arrive.

Members of the Mission's team, members of the congregation, members of the family and friends were on hand at YYC to warmly greet the family when they arrived on the late evening of November 06.

The Presbyterian Church in Canada will be considering a change in its policy regarding human sexuality at the General Assembly meeting in June, 2020. The current definition of marriage is that it is between a man and a woman. The new policy will state that marriage is between a man and a woman or equally between any two persons.

With this new policy, individual congregations will be able to decide whether they wish to continue with the definition of marriage as between a man and a woman or if they wish to support the definition of marriage as between any two persons.

A secret ballot vote is being planned for members of the congregation to indicate their preference. This vote will be held at our Annual Meeting on March 1, 2020 following the morning service.

Another information and discussion session will be held regarding this potential policy change after the morning service on February 9th. Information is readily available on this issue at: https://presbyterian.ca/sexuality/. In particular the LMA – Sexuality Study Guide.pdf has a report on pages 17-28 that discusses biblical references to human sexuality.

If you can have your questions given to the minister or an elder before the meeting this should facilitate clearer discussion and better answers to concerns.

For the lunch we are encouraging people to bring international finger foods that don't require plates and cutlery to be eaten. Expected start time for the meeting is 12:30 PM.
