Minister's Musings

God is at work

I believe God is at work in the world now. You might want to ask, "This kind of world?" A world that has war, a world that has murders, worldwide threat of diseases, assaults, guns, nuclear bombs, famine, genocide, this is all the stuff we get in the daily news. And now the Corona virus!

And so, in this world we are saying that God is at work. We are saying this, not in that make-believe world, but in the real world, the world where we live mostly staying home, cannot even worship at the church. In that world, God is at work. We do not have to be afraid of being realistic, because the Bible is realistic.

When we face a difficult ordeal or trial, it is easy to look back on simpler times and think that life would be much easier if it "was like how it was back then." When we are feeling as though our situation is too difficult or that the challenges are too much for God, we need that reminder of what God has done in the past.

We have this reminder to serve as a way forward in the situations and difficulties of the present and future, especially in those moments where we feel God is not at work. This is the reminder that God's actions in the past serve as a word of hope in those times. For just as God has worked in the past, so is God at work today.

God never stops working. The everlasting God is alive and working today and doing the work that we need. There is not a moment, a struggle, a challenge, a difficulty, an obstacle, or an issue that is too big or even too small for God. God can handle anything. That includes whatever struggle or difficulty we face today. God is at work. The work that God is doing today is still the work of creation. God is at work in recreating the world into his image and bringing forth the promises of a new heaven and new earth. It is the work of redemption and reconciliation. It is the work of renewal and second chances. It is the work of transformation and new energy. It is the work of hope and love. My friends, God is at work today in every situation.

People who believe with all their heart, soul, mind, and strength that no matter the challenge or difficulty, God is alive and well. That is the message we need to share with our friends and neighbors in our community. God is not finished. God is not done with me. God is not done with you. God is not done with Centennial. In fact, God is constantly at work bringing about something new and beautiful in the struggles and challenges that we face.

That gives me hope today. I pray it gives you hope as well. At the heart of our faith is the deep reality of the possibility of experiencing God at work in our lives. Christian history is punctuated by such testimonies. It is not just each of us who need that hope. It is not just our church that needs to experience that hope. I think our neighbors are looking for that hope too. I believe our neighbors are looking for people who believe that God is at work today.

FROM THE SESSION:

At our last meeting we had a presentation on the Cyclical program sponsored by the Presbytery. This initiative is intended to support growth and new worshipping communities. The Anyuak group at our Church may be able to get support from this program to be able to reach out into their community to grow in size. We are working on a new Covenant with the group to align expectations.

The online Zoom service was tested and did not work well due to weak audio and video with the pre-recorded portions such as the music and readings. The next step is to have a Zoom coffee time at 11:00 AM on Sundays after the pre-recorded service. This would need people to watch the service beginning at 10:30 as if it were a normal Sunday morning. If this coffee time works well, we will look at having a live Communion service online on July 5th at 11:00 AM following the taped morning service.
