# PASS IT ON REQUEST

This is an appeal to all the sewers and seamstresses in our congregation. If you have more zippers than you will ever need, perhaps I could put them to good use.

For the past year I have been making "Fidget Mats" for the Alzheimer's Society of Calgary. What is a fidget mat? Fidget mats are often the size of a large placemat. They help to occupy restless hands, and stimulate the mind through touch and focus on texture. They also help individuals feel calm in new or busy environments and come in a variety of colors, themes, and textures. The surface of the mat will have buttons or beads on ribbons, zippers to open and close, snaps to undo, velvet to crush, and fleece to cuddle.

In addition to zippers, another item I like to add to the mats is a key swinging on a leather strap. So if you have extra zippers or keys (small like a suitcase key, or large like a house key), please pass them along. Thank you.
