# **MINISTER'S MUSINGS**

When we expect a long journey, we should be prepared! I am never without a writing instrument, and a little extra cash, just in case. But some folks don't care if their spare tire is flat, and never have an umbrella handy. The easy excuse for our moral failure is to blame somebody else, "The devil made me do it!" we often hear; but it's not really the devil's fault, that's his job, it's our fault for not being prepared to resist.

If we really want to serve God and to be used for His kingdom, we need to be prepared for our spiritual battle! Temptation is very real in our lives. Temptation is all around us. There are many apples out there that we could pick. Before Jesus was ready to begin his three-year public ministry there was something he had to deal with. Evil and the allure of temptation was the issue that Jesus seemingly had to resolve before he felt ready to go out and preach the gospel.

Although he was fully divine, he was also fully human and faced with the same temptations that we do. Matthew says that he was "led by the Spirit" into the wilderness. There he was alone. We

all need to be alone sometimes so that we can commune with God and think things through. And he did not register in a plush hotel. There was even nothing to eat or drink. The sacrifice and rough nature of the desert contributed to his ability to focus of the need to spiritually get ready for his great task that would lead to his cross and empty tomb.

In our spiritual journey, we are led into the wilderness. Wildernesses come in so many shapes and sizes that the only way you can really tell you are in one is to look around for what you normally count on to save your life and come up empty. It was necessary for Jesus to go into the wilderness. It is necessary for us also. Think of it this way. The wilderness isn't a fun place to be. You always end up feeling alone and exhausted.

You may not fast for 40 days, but you will often come to the end of all human resources. And you will feel like giving in and giving up. You will wonder why God has abandoned you. Nothing will make sense; all will seem confusing. But do not despair. Stand your ground. Remember the promises of God. Cling to the Lord. Do not turn back to the old way of life. Do not give in to your emotions. Lean on your brothers and sisters in Christ. God never leads us into the wilderness in order to destroy us. He intends the time of testing to make us stronger. Think of what you find in the desert.

Victory is here! Holiness is here! Spiritual growth is here! The Holy Spirit is here! Jesus is here! So stand your ground and do not give up. Remember that life is all about God. It's not about you. The wilderness isn't about you. It's all about God. Your temptations are not about you. They're all about God. Your spiritual journey isn't about you. It's all about God. Life isn't about your dreams, your agenda, your hopes, your ideas, or your plans. Life is all about God's dreams, God's agenda, God's ideas, and God's plans. It's his kingdom we're praying to come, not ours. So, stand strong in the moment of temptation, trusting that God will give you what you need when you need it.

Lent is a time of self-examination and renewal. During this time, we realise how weak we are when it comes to temptation and ask God to help us, to forgive us, renew us and make a new start. Lent is a time when we rejoice that God is a God of refreshment, of new life, of new beginnings. Our comfort and strength in every temptation is that Christ has already triumphed over temptation on the cross. Christ has won the victory for us.

# **SESSION NOTES**

- The Elder Election is underway with letters and ballots going out starting March 5<sup>th</sup> and with the ballots to be returned by March 26<sup>th</sup>.
- Sunday, March 26<sup>th</sup> will also be a Reception of New Members Service. Please talk to Rev. Kim or an elder if you wish to become a voting member of Centennial.
- The Stewardship Committee has been established with Jean Tupper as Convener and Israel Ayongwa, Annie Edie, Omot Ochudo, Alan Christian and Rev. Kim as members.
- The Session has begun planning a Congregational Visioning Process to look at and plan for the future at Centennial. The hope is to involve as many people as possible to consider what Centennial can become. Saturday, May 13, 2023 has been set as the date. More information will be forthcoming.

The Presbytery Visitation Committee report is available on the Bulletin Board in the Narthex for anyone interested. There were seven recommendations:

- 1. That Session prioritize its commitment to meet with Rev. Kim to address stipend and work related concerns before the next budget.
- 2. That Session and Rev. Kim engage in a clear discussion about timing and succession as Rev. Kim nears his retirement eligibility.
- 3. That semi-annual joint meetings between the Board and Session are renewed.
- 4. That a plan for pastoral care training for elders be identified and implemented with clarification around expectations of pastoral contact by ruling elders and the minister. Support may be requested from the Clergy and Congregational Care Committee of the Presbytery or the National Office.
- 5. That Presbytery supply support with an assessment of Centennial's current equipment for use with Zoom meetings and with grant applications if updated equipment is required.
- 6. That Presbytery provide support with creating a building maintenance schedule and a plan for succession/training of new maintenance personnel as most maintenance is currently handled by one individual.
- 7. In the absence of a General Presbyter, that the Administration Committee offer direction to appropriate resources for support within the Presbytery to fulfill recommendations 5 and 6.

To help coordinate activities involving hospitality and care ministries.


To provide a welcoming, accepting, comforting, supporting, caring environment for members, visitors, friends to enhance their worship experience.
