MINISTER'S MUSINGS Be imitators of God

The apostle Paul says, "Be imitators of God (or Follow God's example)... and walk in the way of love" (Ephesians 5:1). The call to such imitation is not a suggestion, but a command. To be like God, we must live in the way of love. And Christ is the supreme example of love. "And walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us as a fragrant offering and a sacrifice to God (5:2)." Then, we need to prepare ourselves for a strenuous reorientation in the ways that God is love, the ways that God loves, and the ways that we practice love in company with God.

We are commanded to walk in the way of love. Paul's action word is walk, a feet-on-the-ground kind of love. The word "walk" implies a step-by-step, slow but steady process. It refers to our entire manner of life. The point is, the longer you are a Christian, the more your life should be characterized by love. A little boy was following his dad, who was walking in fresh snow. He called out, "Look, daddy, I'm walking in your footsteps!" Our heavenly Father in the person of His own dear Son, walked in

love to the cross for us. Imitate Him by walking in His footsteps of sacrificial love!

To love others, we need to commit ourselves to the body of Christ, the church. It's easy to love mankind in general, but it's more difficult to love the specific individuals in a particular local church. But love is a commitment to seek one another's highest good. This is one reason for church membership. It is the commitment that enables us to work through differences and misunderstandings. Without that commitment, it's just too easy to move down the road to the next church. But guess what? That church will have difficult people too because every church is made up of fallen people. To walk in love, you must be committed to work through relational struggles. Love like that!

The Catholic saint Francis de Sales said, "You learn to speak by speaking, to study by studying, to run by running, to work by working; and just so, you learn to love God and man by loving." *Practice the act* of agape loving. Spiritual muscles are like body muscles. If you don't use them, they weaken. One of the great truths of the Faith is that God supplies what we need **when** we need it. Like manna in the wilderness, God nourishes us, grows us, develops us as we need it.

We will have our first Family Night on September 1. Then we will continue to have the event on the first Wednesday of the month. The purpose of this event is to have concrete space and time to commit ourselves to imitate God and walk in the way of love. It will be a step-by-step, slow but steady process. As I mentioned earlier, our heavenly Father in the person of His own dear Son, walked in love to the cross for us. Let us imitate Him by walking in His footsteps of sacrificial love!
